SATURDAY 22 APRIL

1 Dawn Chorus Walk

Andy Harmer - 6am
Meeting at Forest Hills Car Park

An early morning two-hour walk taking in the local wildlife. Booking essential.

WEDNESDAY 26 APRIL

5 Town & Country

Graham Bondi - 2pm
Meeting at Station Car Park

An approximately three-hour walk around Frodsham and the Marshes.

FRIDAY 28 APRIL

8 Bluebells & Ramsons

Meeting at top of junction of Langdale Way/Townfield Lane

A circular walk passing through Hob Hey Wood lasting one to two hours. This walk is not suitable for people with mobility problems as there are steps, steep slopes and uneven ground, which is slippery if wet.

SUNDAY 30 APRIL

10 Wood & Weaver

Meeting at the top of Bradley Lane junction with Vicarage Lane

An undulating walk lasting approximately two and a half hours around Hob Hey Wood, the River Weaver and along to Belleair at the back of Lady Heyes. Route, if wet will be muddy and many stiles to traverse.

2 Walk around Overton Hill

A three-mile walk to take in parts of the Sandstone Trail, the Delamere Way as well as the War Memorial and Jacob's Ladder, lasting around one and a half hours. Stout footwear is recommended.

THURSDAY 27 APRIL

6 Another Rocky Ramble

Step back into the distant past on this three and a half mile (three-hour) walk around the deep south of the parish, encountering baking tropical deserts and freezing ice-caps – but dress for the usual April weather! Some steep and rocky sections. Parking is limited – if coming by car, please park considerately. Bring a drink.

MONDAY 24 APRIL

3 Pond Trail

A six-mile walk (two to three hours), or just walk a small section, taking in ancient tracks and field paths passing by nine ponds.

A two-hour walk, covering Woodhouse Hill and Snidley Moor areas.

12 The Highs & Lows of Frodsham

Approximately ten-mile (five-hour) walk around the highest and lowest points in the parish with excellent views over open countryside and the Weaver Valley, with the opportunity to spot the indigenous wildlife. Packed lunch will be required and walking boots are recommended.
