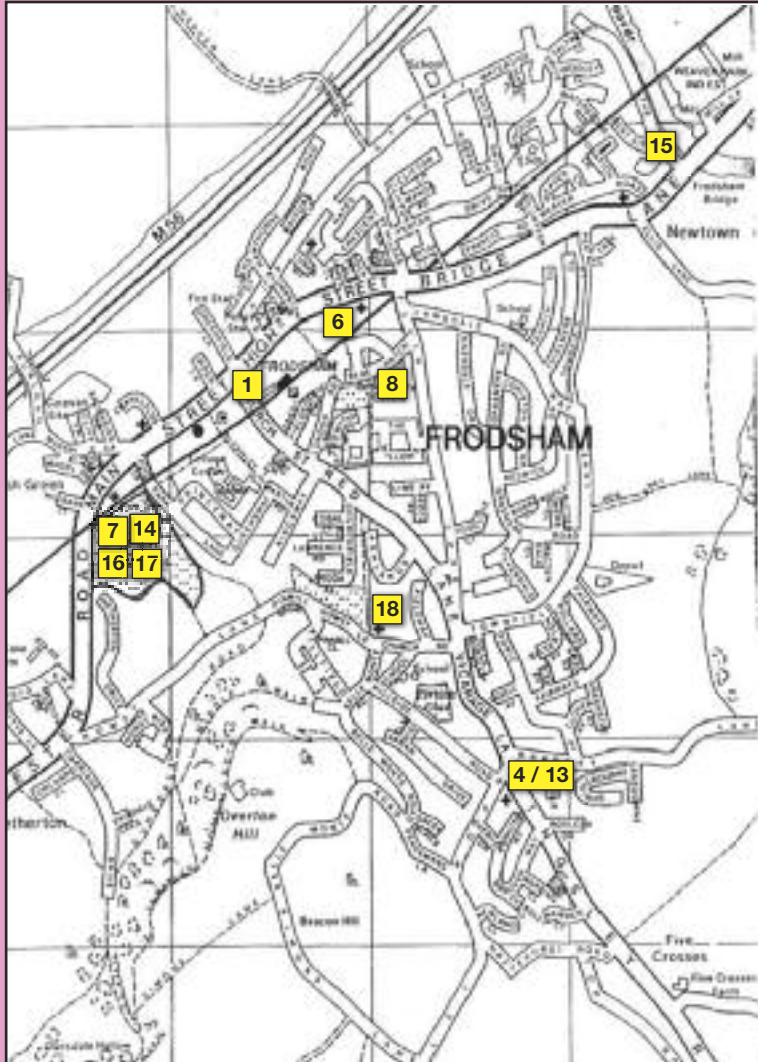

2 Helsby Community Centre
 Helsby WA6 0BW, off A56 Lower Robin Hood Lane.
Grid Ref: SJ486751

3 Alvanley Village Hall
 Churchway, Alvanley Wa6 9BZ, off Manley Road (B5393)

5 Pystyll Gwyn Quarry Car Park
 from Mold bypass (A494) past Llanferres onto B5430. After 1.5 miles quarry and car park are on the left.

9 Kingsley Community Centre
 turn right after church into Westbrook Road then first left to end of Smithy Lane.
Grid Ref: SJ549748

10 Foxhill
 From Frodsham enter via the Lodge off Tarvin Road & turn immediately right. WA6 6XB
Grid Ref: SJ504754

11 Cibo Restaurant Car Park
 CH2 4JR. A56 Mickle Trafford.
Grid Ref: 450713

12 Norton Priory Museum Car Park
 From From M56, Junction 11, turn for Warrington and follow the Norton Priory signs. From all other directions follow the 'All Routes Runcorn Traffic' and then the Norton Priory signs.

1 SATURDAY 26 APRIL
Sandstone Trail: Triumphal Return

Tony Hinkins – 9.30am
 Meet: Bear's Paw, Frodsham
 An all-day walk from Delamere Forest to Frodsham for the final leg of the journey back from Whitchurch. Minibus to Delamere Forest and walk back. Stout footwear, packed lunch and bus fare (£4) required. Meet at Barnsbridge Gates Car Park at 10am if providing own transport. Booking essential if minibus required.

2 SATURDAY 26 APRIL
Three Quarries

Betty Grieve & Sue Lorimer – 10am
 Meet: Helsby Community Centre
 A 2½ (2hr) fairly gentle walk round Helsby Hill to investigate three disused quarries and their history.

3 SUNDAY 27 APRIL
Alvanley Treasure Trail

 Meet: Alvanley Village Hall

Victorian Heritage Walk
